Dear Mom,

Hope you are fine and hope you had a nice Thanksgiving. We are having three guests from the station next to ours tomorrow for thanks. I am writing this on the night of the 26th. We hope to have three chickens, beets, sweet potatoes, mashed potatoes, carrots, tomatoes, lemon pie & jello salad.

We are all in pretty good shape these days. Philip is finally over his diarrhea. It lasted about three weeks but wasn't too severe. I don't know what started it. He looks good & is growing good, but he hasn't had much solid food, only a little cereal. We hope to start him now on more solid foods.

Mom, I just saw a new regulation in the paper today that stops us from receiving gifts & parcels. We have to buy import licenses for anything that comes in now. So please don't send any more packages. If you sent the coffee maybe I can get it through okay. It came without warning so most of us won't receive our Christmas packages. I am sure thankful for the last package you sent with the coffee.

The new rules are getting very strict about imports & money matters. We can't have any dollars nor Traveler's Checks in our possession now. I didn't have any, except for about 12 dollars which I must turn in, but I can't turn in here in Leiah. I hope they don't check me for that.

Good news! We bought a gasoline washer from a couple home on furlough for \$100.00. It works quite well & really saves us a lot of work. We just couldn't keep our clothes washed up as the baby wash is so large. The best thing to have is a washing machine here.
