I thought it was about time I wrote to you. I have wanted to write every day, but one thing and another has come up and I put it off.

Mary got over her trouble okay and hasn't had any more trouble of similar nature. Philip is fine; very hard to watch tho as he tears here & there now. Philip takes a lot of my time to watch him & care for him etc. I wash his diaper by hand every morning etc.

Your long long letter of one short paragraph came with the check so that another are safe now.

I have some pictures of Philip & one of myself I hope to send you in a few days. I'm not getting anything done that I want to these days.

They are having terrible floods here again. The water never reaches Leiah, but they had 6.7 inches of rain in one day in Leiah so you can imagine what happened to the mud houses.

The good Baptists in Bridgeport still remember me from time to time. They send money & clothes & parcels sometime. I will go & visit them when I go home. I hear from the pastor, Rev. Samuelson, quite often & also write him every few months.

I want a cheap one tho.
