Mom I won't get the car after all. The Customs duty on cars was increased 100% so the total custom I would have to pay now on a car would be 150% of its cost plus freight and insurance in shipping it out here. So I dropped the whole business. I had received and import permit too & that's hard to do.

The patterns came in the magazine. Many like them very much.

Also I received my check of pay. I'm always glad to hear how K-State does. Please let me know each game from now on. I suffer it all over now tho.
